RTT-ELC Top Successes

- Putting in place a new Governance mechanism
- Developing an Early Childhood Integrated Data System (ECIDS)
- Developing the FOCUS Tiered Quality Rating and Improvement System– and the supports to make it work
- Creating, piloting, and implementing the Kindergarten Observation Tool (KOT)
- 11 New Mexico Investment Zones



The Data

- Implementation of a coordinated governance structure
- Creation FOCUS programs, or one of the 413 programs participating in FOCUS
- 51 programs moving up at least one Star level in past year
- Development of the KOT or one of the 1,447 teachers assessing 22,073 children with the KOT
- Creation of an ECIDS, including data dashboards



The Data

- One of the consultants that provided services to 244 New Mexico PreK, 190 Special Education, and 67 Title I classrooms in 89 school districts
- Part of one of the 12 communities with early childhood coalitions and action plans
- A recipient of one of the 395 T.E.A.C.H. Scholarships
- One of the 180 professionals trained in the Integrated Learning Approach or 648 professionals trained as trainers on the Pyramid Framework
